A Pastoral Message from Fr. Larry:

Bishops Urge Yes on Propositions 4 and 8, No on Proposition 6

The Catholic bishops of California, as the primary teachers of our faith, are urging us to vote yes on proposition 8 to preserve marriage as authored by God as that of only between a man and woman. On May 15, by a vote of 4-3, the California Supreme Court ruled the current law defining marriage was unconstitutional. This is a radical change in public policy, for it makes no distinction between the traditional vocation of marriage and other partnerships. A yes vote on proposition 8 helps to reject the effort already underway to teach young children in public schools that there is no difference between traditional marriage and "gay marriage." It is important to note proposition 8 is not about discrimination. Under California law, domestic partners will continue to have the same rights, protections and benefits as married spouses. Rather, a yes vote on proposition 8 affirms that traditional marriage and family is the foundation for our society and a sacred, biblical image of humanity's relationship with God.

Also, the bishops are urging us to vote yes on proposition 4, which will prohibit abortion for an unemancipated minor until 48 hours after a physician notifies the minor's parent or legal guardian. It also provides an exception for medical emergencies.
